With great pleasure, I welcome you to the 18th Annual Congress of the American College of Phlebology. The entire organizing committee has worked hard to plan a program to satisfy all Phlebological Practitioners regardless of their level of experience. Many thanks to all our members and previous participants whose valuable evaluations and excellent suggestions have molded the design and content of this program.

The Pre-Congress Day has been expanded to include basic phlebological diagnosis and treatment, basic phlebological surgery and basic phlebological nursing and ultrasound. Breaks are scheduled to allow ample time to visit the exhibitors and meet our industrial supporters. Lunch is provided and allows time for discussion and forging new friendships. Twenty-five abstract presentations will be made Friday and Saturday, with instructional workshops and symposia in the afternoon. Don’t forget your notepad when viewing the poster presentations so you can jot down all those informative tidbits. We have added three more symposia, for a total of nine. The Nursing, Ultrasonography and Phlebological Surgery Sections of the College and the International Union of Phlebology (UIP) will program their own symposia. No one will be left out of this tremendous learning experience. On Sunday morning, we have our last four symposia with a “Sunday Brunch with the Exhibitors” at the break.

The Program Committee has designed this meeting for everyone. Bring your family, nurses, ultrasonographer, and office personnel. The weather will be great, the learning experience exceptional, and the memories unforgettable.




Marco Island Marriott Resort, Golf Club & Spa
