

## Use of ACP Copyrighted Material

Members of the American College of Phlebology and the general public will be allowed to use or directly quote information found on the ACP website and printed materials, provided that they comply with the following citation rules:

1. The source citation must be made immediately following the quoted text.
2. The citation must follow the following format:

(Source: American College of Phlebology, "enclosed in quotes a document reference if any," *American College of Phlebology Website*, hyperlinked URL here; accessed <date formatted as DD Month YYYY.>)

EXAMPLE:  
(Source: American College of Phlebology, "Phlebology: The Treatment of Leg Veins," *American College of Phlebology Website*, <http://www.phlebology.org/brochure.htm>; accessed 4 November 2003.)
3. Variance from this format may be obtained upon written request and approval of the Executive Director.
4. The "accessed" date in the citation is the date the information was copied from the ACP website.
5. The parentheses surrounding the entire citation are optional.
6. The URL reference should be hyperlinked and page-specific, if possible.
7. The entire source citation should be in a font size no smaller than 8 point, and can be in a font style of the web designer's choosing.
8. Any images and/or pictures found on the ACP website that are being used courtesy of another entity (for example, from a company or individual doctor) may **not** be used. Permission to use such images must be obtained from the original source.
9. Any scientific abstract or other information attributed to a specific author or entity must be cited as such, incorporating the original author or entity as well as the ACP in the citation.

Users are required to e-mail the Headquarters' Office of the ACP as a courtesy so that we may examine the source citation for accuracy and completeness of the source citation.
